

## AFC Round Up – 7<sup>th</sup> November 2009

The performance of the day was in the AFC was at Turney Road, where Old Belgravians thrashed in-form Old Salvatorians 5-0 in Senior One. Belgravians controlled the first half though a depleted Salvos team hit the post from thirty yards early on.
