

Amateur Football Combination Report – 2nd October 2010

On a high scoring day in the AFC Premier Division, Old Minchendenians and Old Hamptonians fought out a thrilling 3-3 draw. Hamptonians opened the scoring just before half-time, Jonathan Moffett danced around two men and lofted the ball into the top corner, and extended their lead on the hour through Luke Fernandes. Minch pulled one back through a Craig Bowe penalty, and equalised on 80 minutes through Aaron D'Silva's far post header. Five minutes later Adam Calvert headed Hamps back in the lead, only to see Alex Heady to grab Minch's third and a share of the points.

Old Meadonians and Old Suttonians reached halftime scoreless, Nick Woodward heading over from Suttonians the best chance. On the hour Jack Costello fired home from the edge of the area to give Meads the lead, which Colin Hawkins quickly doubled. A soft penalty allowed Hawkins to make it three, only to see Phil Colmer pull a goal back, breaking from midfield to lob home, but with five minutes left Hawkins rounded the keeper to complete his hat-trick and a comfortable 4-1 win which takes them to the top of the Premier, on goal difference from Albanian.

In Senior One, Old Uffingtonians beat Glyn Old Boys comfortably, Ryan Nelson netting twice and the remaining goals from Liam Joyce, Theo Russell and Jed Davies, whilst in Senior Three North William Fitt were too good for UCL Academicals Reserves, 3-0 up at half-time as Jermaine Hallowell, Roy Hallowell and James Mitchell took advantage of a porous defence, and making it four in the second half through Miguel Heie before Rob Soutar grabbed a consolation for Accies, leaving them in the lower half of the table whilst Fitt moved top.

In the AFA Surrey/Kent Senior Cup, HAC started quickly against Chertsey Old Salesians, Tim Kaiser setting up Stuart Holt to score, and Holt quickly set up Oli Whyman to make it two. In the second half, Holt crossed for Andrew Metcalfe to head home the third at the back post, and made it four as Sam Gibson crossed for Holt to fire home. In the last fifteen minutes, HAC stepped off the gas and Chertsey grabbed two consolation goals, Larry Fifield from the penalty spot and Zach Wallace, but HAC never really looked in danger and ran out 4-2 winners.
